





The State of CHW Employment and Funding in Cook County

May 31, 2023

Context

Sinai Urban Health Institute (SUHI) and the Health and Medicine Policy Research Group (HMPRG) have released results from a first-ever survey of employers utilizing Community Health Workers, aimed at mapping the landscape for CHWs across the region. The Cook County Common Indicator Employer Survey showed strong use of CHWs in the wake of the pandemic, but that Cook County faces some tough decisions as the public health emergency ends with 64% of the respondents serving Cook County reporting that none of their funding comes from a sustainable source.

Financing:

As pandemic-related funding opportunities that bolstered the CHW workforce in Illinois end, leveraging braided multisource funding mechanisms is critical to sustain CHW employment. Medicaid reimbursement for CHW activities is considered a sustainable source of funding and can be currently accessed in a variety of ways:

Current Medicaid reimbursement options:

- Diabetes Prevention Program services
- Managed Care Organizations (MCOs) Administrative expenditures
- Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs) Total cost proposal per visit rate

Future Medicaid reimbursement options (Pending Illinois CHW Review Board processes and approval of a Medicaid State Plan Amendment):

- CHW activity Fee For Service billing under a certified Medicaid provider*
 - *Billing accessibility for community-based organizations will be explored in the future

Other funding opportunities we're exploring:

- Medicaid 1115 Waiver
- Billing with Z Codes for Social Determinates of Health activities
- Apprenticeships and Workforce Development Funding
